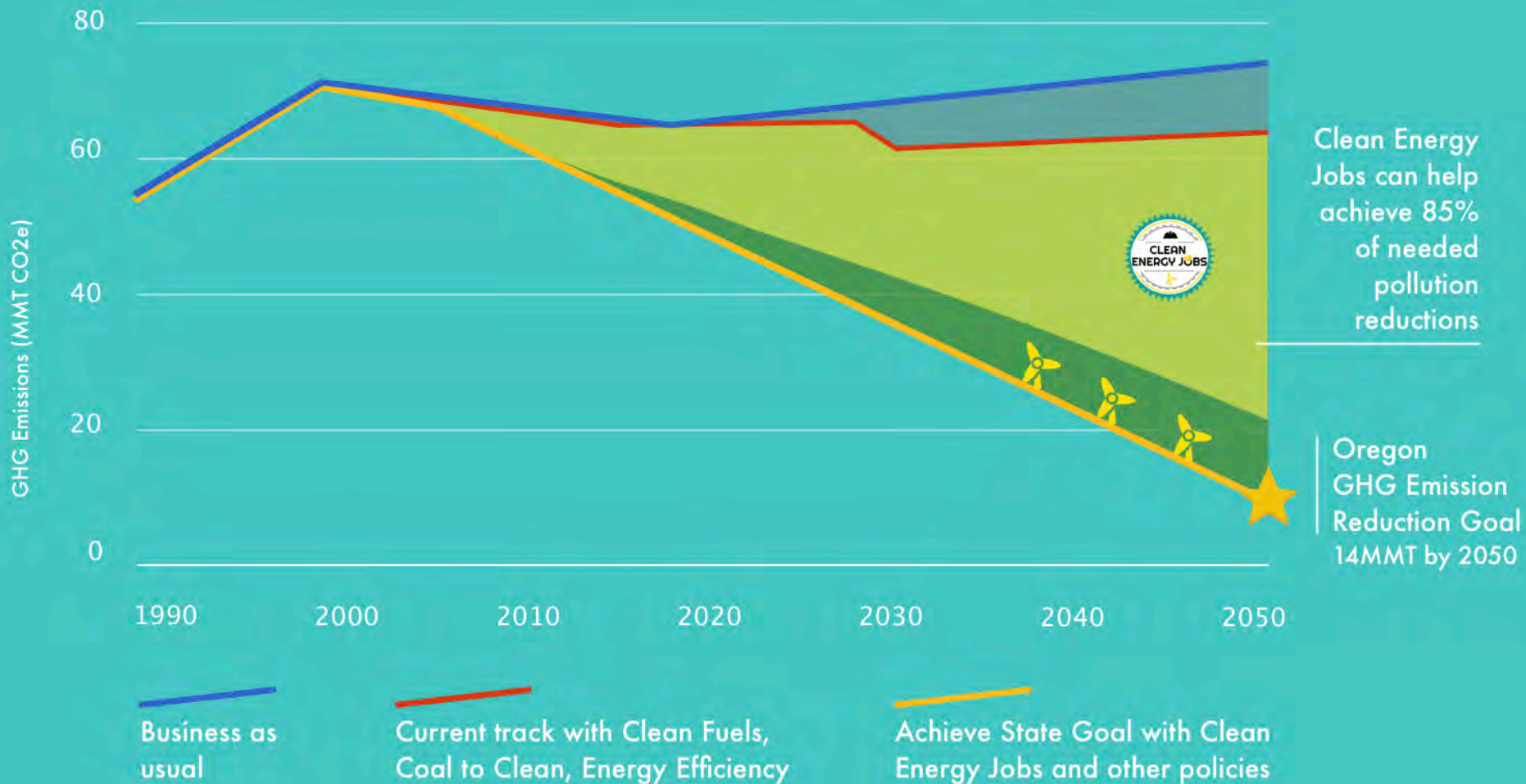

On behalf of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon (the "**Tribe**"), I write to express strong support for House Bill (HB) 2020, with amendments to clarify and strengthen the role of Oregon's nine federally recognized Indian tribes (the "**Nine Tribes**") in reducing carbon emissions to combat climate change. HB 2020 would undertake serious efforts to prevent and mitigate the continuing effects of the global climate crisis. The Tribe agrees that these efforts are necessary, and further believes that a prominent role for the Nine Tribes is integral to the success of these efforts in the long term.
