FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

[NDN Community Action Fund](#); Awards up to \$30,000 as available. Supports efforts that include community organizing, amplification of community voices, and utilize a wide variety of tactics imperative to shifting the political and financial systems that are impacting communities. Areas of emphasis may include climate justice and accelerating the just energy transition in Indigenous communities. **Deadline: October 31.**

[NOAA Coastal Habitat Restoration and Resilience Grants for Tribes and Underserved Communities](#); Awards up to \$45M available for projects that will advance habitat restoration and climate resilience priorities of tribes and underserved communities with \$20M set aside for tribes. Funding can support capacity building, project planning, actionable science, restoration work, and more. **Deadline: December 19.**

[Notices of Funding Opportunities for Hazard Mitigation Assistance Grants](#); \$800M is available for the [Flood Mitigation Assistance](#) grant program and \$1B is available to the [Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities](#) grant program. FEMA's two competitive mitigation grant programs provide states, local communities, tribes and territories funding to address high-level future risks to natural disasters such as wildfires, drought, hurricanes, earthquakes, extreme heat, and increased flooding to foster greater community resilience and reduce disaster suffering. **Deadline: February 29, 2024.**

[Request for Information - Congressionally Mandated Unmet Needs Report](#); The Bureau of Indian Affairs' Branch of Tribal Climate Resilience (TCR) received a Congressional mandate to provide "information on the unmet need of coastal Tribes in the lower 48 states that are facing relocation due to climate impacts." TCR is working with the Institute for Tribal Environmental Professionals based out of Northern Arizona University and others to produce a report with this information due December 2023. All federally-recognized tribes that self-identify as coastal and/or are located within a coastal watershed within the lower 48 states are eligible to provide input. *They are seeking input through November 3rd!* To learn more about report goals, outcomes, and input opportunities, visit: nau.edu/unmetneed2023.
