FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Community Water Justice Awards; Up to \$50K awards are available through the University of Oregon Just Futures Institute. Projects that address water justice policy framework areas will be prioritized. Examples of eligible projects include funding water positions, investing in water stewardship and policy education, and developing equitable emergency response systems. **Deadline: February 1, 2024.**

Notices of Funding Opportunities for Hazard Mitigation Assistance Grants; \$800M is available for the **Flood Mitigation Assistance** grant program and \$1B is available to the **Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities** grant program. FEMA's two competitive mitigation grant programs provide states, local communities, tribes and territories funding to address high-level future risks to natural disasters such as wildfires, drought, hurricanes, earthquakes, extreme heat, and increased flooding to foster greater community resilience and reduce disaster suffering. **Deadline: February 29, 2024.**

Inflation Reduction Act Community Change Grants Program; EPA is accepting applications on a rolling basis for \$2 billion in Inflation Reduction Act funding available to support community-driven projects that build capacity for communities to tackle environmental and climate justice challenges, strengthen their climate resilience, and advance clean energy. Awards vary depending on application track. Technical assistance available. **Deadline: November 21, 2024.**

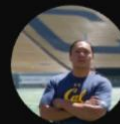
