

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Community Self-Determination Grant</u>; NDN Collective announced \$250K in funding available to Indigenous Tribal Nations, Pueblos, tribal communities, grassroots movements and Indigenous-led organizations to support and invest in their long-term visions, sustainability, and power building, and fortifying the self-determination of Indigenous Peoples to create a just, equitable, and sustainable world for all people and the planet. Climate and Indigenous justice are at the heart of the intent behind this opportunity. **Deadline: July 17.**

<u>Tribal Access to Emerging Private Markets for Climate Mitigation or Forest</u>

Resilience; USDA Forest Service announced a competitive grant opportunity authorized under the Inflation Reduction Act and is available to Tribal Nations, Tribal organizations and other Tribal entities specifically. The Forest Service is providing at least \$20M in competitive funds to support Tribal Nation participation in emerging private markets for climate mitigation or forest resilience. Examples of emerging markets and related proposed projects may include markets for water quality and quantity, carbon, biodiversity, and wetland restoration. Deadline: August 21.

BIA Tribal Climate Resilience Annual Awards Program; BIA has announced over \$120M will be made available across three funding categories: Category 1 - Planning (\$250K max, competitive); Category 2 - Implementation (\$4M max, competitive); and Category 3 - Relocation, Managed Retreat, Protect-in-Place (\$150K per year over 3 years, non-competitive) Staff. TCR awards may also be used to meet other Federal and non-Federal cost share/match requirements required by statute. Access the RFP here. Deadline: October 18.

<u>Inflation Reduction Act Community Change Grants Program</u>; EPA is accepting

applications on a rolling basis for \$2 billion in Inflation Reduction Act funding available to support community-driven projects that build capacity for communities to tackle environmental and climate justice challenges, strengthen their climate resilience, and advance clean energy. Awards vary depending on application track. Technical assistance available. **Deadline: November 21.**

The White House Council on Native American Affairs created a Critical Minerals Working Group and invites Tribes to consult on the September 2023 Recommendations to Improve Mining on Public Lands report. Through this consultation, the Administration seeks to prioritize and implement recommendations from the report that will benefit Tribes. POLICY HIGHLIGHT

The Biden-Harris Administration invests \$120 Million to help Tribes build climate resilience, as part of President's Investing in America agenda. This funding is intended to help Tribal communities prepare for the most severe climate-related environmental threats to their homelands through the BIA Tribal Climate Resilience Annual Awards Program. With today's announcement, Tribes and Tribal organizations will be able to apply for grants in the planning and implementation categories. These categories encompass a range of activities affecting every Tribe, such as climate adaptation planning, drought measures, wildland fire mitigation, community-driven relocation, managed retreat, protect-in-place efforts, and ocean and coastal management. The BIA will provide technical assistance to support Tribes and Tribal organizations in applying for these funds, including an informational webinar, a grant writing webinar and virtual office hours to help answer questions. 
