

#### **FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES**

<u>Community Self-Determination Grant</u>; NDN Collective announced \$250K in funding available to Indigenous Tribal Nations, Pueblos, tribal communities, grassroots movements and Indigenous-led organizations to support and invest in their long-term visions, sustainability, and power building, and fortifying the self-determination of Indigenous Peoples to create a just, equitable, and sustainable world for all people and the planet. Climate and Indigenous justice are at the heart of the intent behind this opportunity. **Deadline: July 17.** 

### <u>Tribal Access to Emerging Private Markets for Climate Mitigation or Forest</u>

**Resilience**; USDA Forest Service announced a competitive grant opportunity authorized under the Inflation Reduction Act and is available to Tribal Nations, Tribal organizations and other Tribal entities specifically. The Forest Service is providing at least \$20M in competitive funds to support Tribal Nation participation in emerging private markets for climate mitigation or forest resilience. Examples of emerging markets and related proposed projects may include markets for water quality and quantity, carbon, biodiversity, and wetland restoration. **Deadline: August 21.** 

<u>Inflation Reduction Act Community Change Grants Program</u>; EPA is accepting applications on a rolling basis for \$2 billion in Inflation Reduction Act funding available to support community-driven projects that build capacity for communities to tackle environmental and climate justice challenges, strengthen their climate resilience, and advance clean energy. Awards vary depending on application track. Technical assistance available. **Deadline: November 21.**

## **POLICY HIGHLIGHT**

Biden-Harris Administration invests \$60 million to build a climate-ready workforce through Investing in America agenda. The funding will support nine projects around the nation, with \$50 million going directly to the projects and \$10 million for technical assistance to support the grantees. One of the projects, "Tribal Stewards: Cultivating Tribal leadership & equity in natural resource co-stewardship & climate resilience", is a partnership between community colleges and Tribal Nations in Washington state that aims to cultivate a new generation of Tribal leaders and co-stewards adept in integrative natural resources management and climate resilience. Through holistic support and redesigned educational pathways, the Tribal Stewards initiative will train both Tribal and non-Tribal graduates to contribute to co-stewardship, collaboration and climate resilience efforts that serve Tribal communities.


